<b>BOARD OF SUPERVISORS</b> Valerie Brown	C+	D+	Not available for citizen input due to her outside consulting jobs which severely detracts from her accessibility to her constituents. Good on some issues, but is too supportive of big resort developments in her district.
Mike Kerns	D+	D-	Will meet with environmentalists, but does not support our issues. Continues to disappoint on public open space issues in the south county, especially Lafferty.
Tim Smith	C	D	Is not open to citizen input. He has supported certain environmental initiatives as long as they have not conflicted with development interests.
Paul Kelley	F	F	Actively supports policies that are destructive to the environment. Only responsive to development interests.
Mike Reilly	A	A	The environmental leader on the Board of Supervisors. Available and receptive to input from the environmental community.
<b>CLOVERDALE CITY COUNCIL</b> Mike Nixon	B	B	Shows interest in some environmental initiatives, but has been too cautious about being identified as "green". Is a good listener and does make himself available for public input.
Gus Wolter	B	C+	Leans towards pro-environmental positions, but when pushed sides with development interests. Is approachable and will listen to environmentalists.
Mary Ann Brigham	A	B	Almost always on the right side of environmental issues. Not as available for citizen input as she used to be.
Bob Jehn	B-	C	Shows concern for some environmental issues, but is too supportive of the gravel mining in the Russian River. Seems to be swayed by business interests.
Gail Pardini-Plass	D	D	Does not appear to be conscious of environmental concerns.

Lisa Schaffner	D	C-	Typically opposes environmental positions. Will listen, but is not responsive to citizen input.
Mark Gleason	D	F	Ill-informed on environmental issues. His only concern seems to be the economic impacts of decisions made. Not responsive to citizen input.
Jason Liles	B+	A	Good environmental voting record. Exhibits genuine interest in citizen input.
Kent Mitchell	B	B-	Generally on the right side of environmental issues. Open to citizen input, but abstains on too many votes.
<b>PETALUMA CITY COUNCIL</b> David Glass	A	A	A solid environmental voting record. Listens to and encourages citizen input.
Mike O'Brien	D	C-	Reliably votes against the environment on all key issues facing the city. Accessible to some environmentalists, but not generally open to citizen input.
Keith Canevaro	C-	C+	Typically votes with the anti-environmental majority, but sometimes breaks ranks and votes the right way. Has done some outreach to encourage citizen/environmental input.
Mike Harris	D	D	Another reliable vote against the environment. Not responsive to environmentalists' input.
Mike Healy	B	B	Generally a good environmental vote. Is available for and listens to citizen input.
Bryant Moynihan	F	F	Consistently votes against the environment. Show no interest in receiving citizen input.
Pamela Torliatt	A	A	Strong environmental leader who can always be counted on to vote the right way. Always listens to and encourages citizen input.

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<b>ROHNERT PARK CITY COUNCIL</b> Armando Flores	D-	D-	Displays a continual disregard for the environment at the expense of his loyalty to development interests. Ignores citizen input.
Greg Nordin	D	D	Frequently disregards the environment at the expense of his loyalty to development interests. Does not listen to citizen input.
Vicki Vidak-Martinez	C-	C-	Often puts development interests as her top priority to the exclusion of any environmental concerns. Has been particularly rude to public input.
Jake Mackenzie	A	A	Displays guts, vision, and commitment for the environment. Listens to citizen input despite taking intense heat personally and in the press.
Amie Spradlin	D	D	Follows the lead of Armando Flores. Does not appear to be able to stand on her own or to listen to citizen input.
<b>SANTA ROSA CITY COUNCIL</b> Sharon Wright	F	D	Does not show any concern for the environment. She does not listen to citizen input and she continues to flirt with conflict of interest by being employed by the development community.
Jane Bender	C	B-	Has shown some genuine concern for some environmental issues. She is responsive to some citizen and environmental input.
Bob Blanchard	C-	C	Has been good at supporting bike path issues. Not particularly receptive to citizen input.
Janet Condron	D-	F	Shows no concern for supporting the environment. Development interests have undue influence on her.
Noreen Evans	A	A	Takes the lead on many environmental issues. She encourages and listens to citizen input.
Mike Martini	D	C	His role as the CEO of the county's powerful special interest developer group, Sonoma County Alliance, is a direct conflict of interest.
Steve Rabinowitsh	A	A	Shows courage and leadership on environmental issues. He is a caring and careful listener to citizen input.
<b>SEBASTOPOL CITY COUNCIL</b> Craig Litwin	A	B	A solid record of support for environmental issues. He is responsive and respectful of citizen input.
Linda Kelley	A	A	Takes a leadership position on all environmental issues. Listens and participates in discussions with constituents and is able to learn and teach in an open manner.
Robert Anderson	C-	C-	He often supports policies and projects that value economics over the environment. He does not seem to listen to the environmental ethics of the Sebastopol residents.
Larry Robinson	A	B+	Consistently votes the right way on environmental issues. Listens to and communicates well with citizens.
Sam Spooner	A	B	Consistently supports environmental issues. He actively solicits and is receptive to citizen input.
